Policy Statement:

Outline the risks of the sport and the method of ensuring safety and risk management concerns have been addressed.

Procedure

It is recognized that the sports of Alpine Skiing and Snowboarding have many risk and safety factors that need to be addressed before individuals participate in training exercises or competitions. Zones should commence the following actions before administering their CADS Alberta Zone programs.

- Talk about safety and risk management; identify risks, assess and plan.
- Develop an Emergency Action Plan for your club and distribute to your membership.
- Ensure that all participants are properly registered with CADS Alberta.
- Ensure that all volunteers are registered members and CADS Trained/Certified.
- Ensure that all coaches are members in good standing with CADS/ACA/CSIA and are up to date with all licensing requirements.
- Ensure that all camps and projects have been properly sanctioned and insured by CADS/CADS Alberta.
- Zone leadership, executives and their staff should review the CSA Critical Incident Management Protocol, CSA Ski Club Risk Management Guide and the CSA Incident Report Form.
- Use special consideration when planning speed or competition training.
